RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING ALCOHOL USE

Consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted at City Facilities in accordance with the following procedure:

1. Intent to serve or sell alcoholic beverages must be noted on the use application form and permission received from the City Manager/Designee and Police Chief/Designee
2. If an individual or group is going to sell alcoholic beverages at any activity, the applicant must obtain written permission from the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and submit a copy of the permit along with the use application.
3. No alcoholic beverages will be permitted to be taken from the facility; all alcoholic beverages must be consumed on the premises.
4. No alcohol is permitted to be stored on the premises of any City facility.
5. There shall be no "open bar" permitted. An "open bar" is defined as a bar where alcohol is served without a charge for each drink. Beer and wine may be served in conjunction with a dinner event. Wine and beer tasting events may be conducted. There shall be no alcoholic beverages served during public dances.
6. No alcohol shall be served, furnished or given in any way to any minor; doing so may result in civil or criminal prosecution, including damages for injuries the minors cause. The indemnification provided by paragraph II-I above includes claims arising out of such alcohol use by minors.
7. No alcohol shall be serviced to any person who is obviously drunk or who is known to be habitually drunk; doing so may result in criminal prosecution.
8. No alcohol is permitted on the premises of any City facility during hours of operation for the conduct of official business.
